There exists a need to raise the knowledge base of all attorneys who practice in juvenile court regarding the substantive law and practice fields outside of juvenile law in order to timely spot and resolve issues that impact dependents and wards of the Juvenile Court.



2 FOR GOOD CAUSE SHOWN THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that  
3 attorneys who seek to continue to practice Juvenile Court shall have  
4 eight (8) hours of training or education over a period of three (3)  
5 years in allied subject matter in areas outside of juvenile law.  
6

7 For attorneys practicing in dependency law, this requirement  
8 shall be over and above the requirements set forth in Orange County  
9 Local Rule 907(C) (1) (b) .

10 For attorneys practicing in delinquency law, this requirement  
11 cannot be satisfied by training in delinquency or criminal law.  
12

13 For attorneys practicing in both dependency and delinquency  
14 law, the training must be in subjects other than delinquency or  
15 criminal law, and must be over and above the requirements set forth in  
16 Orange County Local Rule 907 (C) (1) (b) . However, there need only be a  
17 total of eight(8)hours in training.
