# LIMITED CONSERVATORSHIP WORKSHOP For an Adult or Soon-to-Be Adult with Developmental Disabilities

### **Description**:

This workshop is for anyone who does not have a lawyer and wants procedural help to file a limited conservatorship petition for an adult, or soon-to-be adult with developmental disabilities. At the workshop, you can also ask to be screened for additional Legal Aid services.

### What to Do Before You Arrive:

Before you attend the Limited Conservatorship Workshop, the Court encourages you to complete this easy-to-use-form program at <u>https://goo.gl/vqYfm9</u>. Simply click on the blue "Proceed" box and follow the instructions provided. When finished, save your forms on your computer, print out a the completed forms and bring them with you to the workshop.

After the presentation, you will have an opportunity to have questions answered and, if time allows, to obtain a pre-filing document review. If you want to make changes to the forms you created, you may use the public computers in the Self-Help Center to access the program following the presentation and review.
