Exercising the authority granted by Governor Gavin Newsom's Executive Order N-38-20 and the June 18, 2020 Order of Chief Justice Tani Cantil-Sakauye, Chair of the California Judicial Council, issued in response to the June 17, 2020 Request for a Judicial Emergency Order made by the Superior Court or Orange County ("Court"), this Court HEREBY FINDS AND ORDERS THE FOLLOWING ADDITIONAL MEASURES:

- 1. The Court extends the time period provided in section 313 of the Welfare and Institutions Code within which a minor taken into custody pending dependency proceedings must be released from custody to not more than 3 days. (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(11).) This applies only to minors for whom the statutory deadline otherwise would expire from 6/22/2020 to 7/17/2020, inclusive.
- 2. The Court extends the time period provided in section 315 of the Welfare and Institutions Code within which a minor taken into custody pending dependency proceedings

must be given a detention hearing to not more than 3 days. (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(11).) This applies only to minors for whom the statutory deadline otherwise would expire from 6/22/2020 to 7/17/2020, inclusive.

It is the intent of this Order to provide the maximum length of constitutionally permitted continuance days authorized by the June 18, 2020 Order of Chief Justice Tani Cantil-Sakauye issued in response to the June 17, 2020 Request for a Judicial Emergency Order made by the Court. Any conflicts in the above language are to be resolved in favor of granting the lengthier of the continuance options.
