

Orange County Superior Court 2026 Temporary Judge Training Information

SAVE THE DATE

As mandated by rules 2.812 and 2.813 of the California Rules of Court ("CRC"), you may not serve as a Temporary Judge unless you first attend **3 hours** of training in the following two areas (i.e., 6 hours total):

1. Judicial Ethics 2. Bench Conduct & Demeanor

Location: Central Justice Center, 700 Civic Center Drive West, Santa Ana, CA 92701

Ethics and Bench Conduct & Demeanor:

- April 25, 2026: 9:00 AM 12:15 PM & 1:15 PM 4:30 PM
- April 29, 2026: 4:00 PM 7:15 PM
- April 30, 2026: 4:00 PM 7:15 PM

Please note that this training is mandatory for all attorneys who serve as Temporary Judges in Orange County. **Online training will not be accepted as a substitute** <u>in</u> <u>these two areas</u>.

In addition, CRC rules 2.812 and 2.813, and Code of Civil Procedure section 116.240 subdivision (b) mandate that Temporary Judges also take a three-hour course on the substantive law in each subject area in which the attorney will serve as a Temporary Judge. You will be required to complete the following training, **which is dependent upon your selected/approved panel assignment(s):**
