15 Exercising the authority granted by Governor Gavin Newsom’s Executive Order
16 N-38-20 and the January 7, 2021 Order of Chief Justice Tani Cantil-Sakauye issued in
17 response to the January 5, 2021 Request for a Judicial Emergency Order made by the
18 Superior Court of Orange County (“Court”), this Court **HEREBY FINDS AND ORDERS**
19 **THE FOLLOWING ADDITIONAL MEASURES:**
20

21 1. The Court extends the time period provided in Penal Code section 825 within
22 which a defendant charged with a felony offense must be taken before a magistrate from
23 48 hours to not more than 7 days in cases in which the statutory deadline otherwise would
24 expire from 1/11/2021 to 2/5/2021, inclusive. (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(8).)


26 3. The Court extends the time period provided in section 1382 of the Penal
27 Code for the holding of a criminal trial by not more than 30 days in cases in which the

1 statutory deadline otherwise would expire from 1/11/2021 to 2/5/2021, inclusive. (Gov.
2 Code, § 68115(a)(10).)

3 It is the intent of this Order to provide the maximum length of constitutionally
4 permitted continuance days authorized by the January 7, 2021 Order of Chief Justice Tani
5 Cantil-Sakauye issued in response to the January 5, 2021 Request for a Judicial Emergency
6 Order made by the Court. Any conflicts in the above language are to be resolved in favor of
7 granting the lengthier of the continuance options.
