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
14 Pursuant to Welfare and Institutions Code section 628, minors taken into temporary custody by
15 the Orange County Probation Department are housed at Orange County Juvenile Hall, Youth
16 Guidance Center or Youth Leadership Academy. In order to ensure the medical well-being of
17 these minors while in custody, it is necessary that appropriate physician-recommended
18 emergency medical care be authorized.

19 For good cause shown, it is hereby ordered that the Orange County Health Care Agency
20 is authorized to obtain physician-recommended emergency medical care for a minor who is in
21 need of such care as recommended by a physician, and for which there has been no
22 parent/legal guardian located to provide consent, and who cannot otherwise be treated without
23 the authorization of the Juvenile Court. The Probation Department shall continue their attempts to
24 obtain consent from the minor's parent(s)/legal guardian(s) prior to the administration of such
treatment.

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Nothing contained herein shall be construed to modify or limit the requirements of the California Board of State and Community Corrections, Title 15 Minimum Standard for Local Detention Facilities sections 1432-1439.
