3. Assist the Deputy Probation Officers in the preparation of a social study report and provide any criminal record the minor may have in his/her native country.

4. Ascertain the financial status of the minor and family as it applies to the ability to pay restitution and legal expenses incurred in the United States.

5. Conduct necessary interviews to expedite the process of the immediate return of a minor to his/her native country in those cases where no further legal proceedings are deemed necessary either by screening of the Orange County Probation Department or rejection of the pending petition by the Orange County District Attorney's Office.
